

Cursive handwriting

Cursive handwriting is, put simply, joined-up writing. There are two different types: fully (or continuous) cursive, where every letter in a word is joined, so you don't lift the pen off the paper until the end of the word, and part cursive where most letters are joined, but not all.

At Alverton we teach children to print letters first (i.e. write them separately, without joins) and that every letter starts from the line.
