The Firework Code

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't let off fireworks after 11pm.

HAMBLETON FOODSHARE

What We Do:

Hambleton FoodShare is a community partnership which provides emergency food parcels for people who are struggling to feed themselves and their families. The aim of this scheme is to provide a three-day emergency food parcel to people in temporary financial crisis.

We would like to thank all the businesses and individuals who are supporting us during the current crisis it is really amazing - THANK YOU

We are still open on a Monday evening 4pm – 6pm. We are based in the Living Rooms in Garthway arcade, Northallerton, DL7 8NS.

We are now accepting self-referrals for your FIRST visit, then we will give you information on how to get further referrals from one of our agency partners – we can accept referrals via e mail text or on the phone. If you need help or advice on where to get a referral please ring 07514 244158 or email: info@hambletonfoodshare.org.uk. Please note we are operating a 1 person per family into the premises at a time when collecting parcels and we would ask that you respect social distancing outside when queuing for a parcel.

I Need a Food Parcel:

The volunteer led Hambleton FoodShare is open every Monday between 4pm and 6pm, and is located at The Living Rooms 5 Garthway Arcade, Northallerton. Garthway Arcade is near Grovers toy shop or accessed via the Applegarth car park near the Chinese takeaway. **Should you need a parcel you are welcome to come along without a voucher or recommendation for your first visit.** Then we will direct you to one of our agency partners for vouchers for future visits.

What Happens On My First Visit?

We realise how hard it is to come along, so you will be asked only a few questions to enable us to help you.

You won't be asked to show proof of benefits and other such details.

We will give you information of how to get further help, according to your circumstances through our partner agencies who can issue foodshare vouchers.

You will be given your first food parcel, according to the size of your family. This will be enough food for three days and is made up of tins and packet goods, plus fresh bread and spread.

This week they have also learnt about Stonehenge and created some lovely artwork.

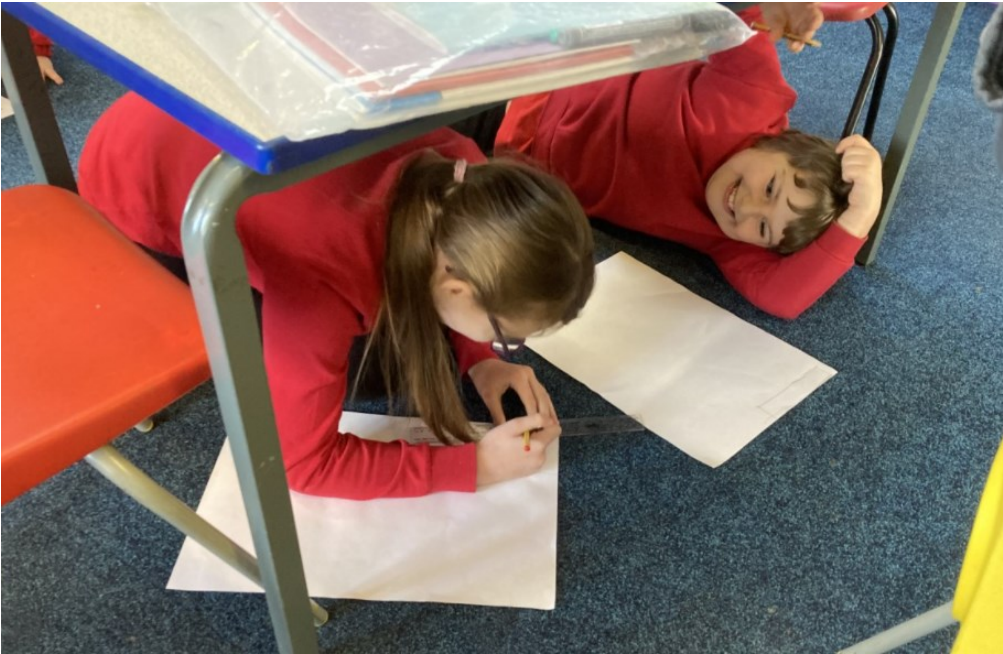
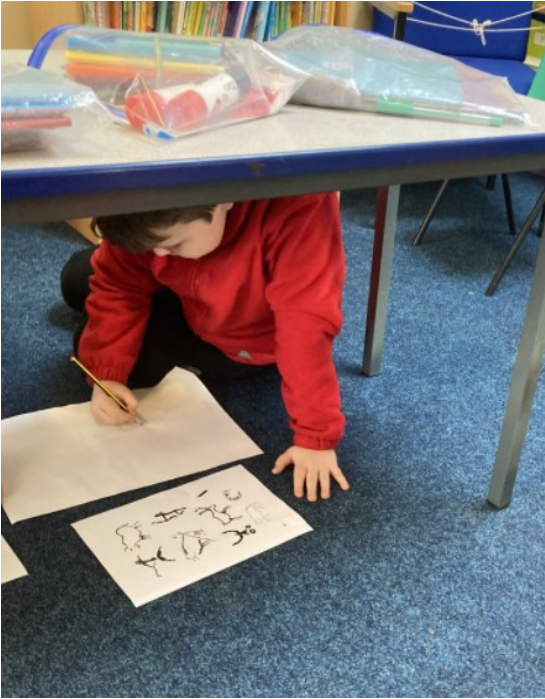
'Stonehenge has been standing for about 5000 years ago and was built in stages' - Ella Year 3
