Breakfast Club and Rainbow Club Behaviour Policy

Updated September 2023



We expect the same behaviour in Breakfast and Rainbow Club as we do in school – see Alverton's behaviour policy.

Breakfast/Rainbow Club Rewards

- Stickers
- Certificates
- Praise
- Responsibility of a job/being a special helper

If a child is not behaving as expected, the following will happen:

- 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' reminder
- Adult will give a verbal reminder of expectations
- If the child's behaviour is still not acceptable, they will have 10 minutes 'cooling off' time away from the room/area
- Once calm, they will speak restoratively about what had happened with the adult and then will be able to re-join the room/area again
- Behaviour incidents will also be recorded in a behaviour log book

<u>Consequences</u>

If a child's behaviour does not meet Alverton's expectations, the consequences may include:

- Inform class teacher and headteacher
- Inform parents
- Parents contacted to collect early
- Discussion with Playleader, parents and headteacher
- Not being allowed to come to Breakfast/Rainbow Club the following day/rest of the week

If a child's behaviour is continuously unacceptable and disruptive/unsafe, then we may make the decision that the child will no longer be able to attend Breakfast/Rainbow Club.
