Learning Highlights from Spring 23

This half term we have been learning all about The Romans. In English, we enjoyed reading 'The journal of Iliona, a young slave'. Year 4 have loved getting creative with their writing. They have carried out research about Roman baths, wrote fascinating newspaper reports about gladiator fights and a persuasive letter to a Roman Leader.

Within this History topic, we have looked at who the Romans were and why they invaded Britain. The children were amazing at drawing the famous Colosseum.

Maths

In maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. Year 3 have enjoyed learning about how to use array to multiply and use equipment to share numbers into equal groups when dividing. We are getting much more confident with our 2s, 5s and 10s.

Science

This half term, the children loved learning about electricity. They have been very practical, by creating a series circuit using the equipment, which was very fun! Alongside this, they can recognise identifying conductor and insulators.

PE

All children have really enjoyed the unit of Dance and Tag Rugby. All children created a dance routine based around the theme of cats. They linked movement together brilliantly and showed great expression.

New Learning for Spring 23

This half term we are having a science focus with our new book 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin'. The children will be identifying how sound is made and how we hear it. For English, we will be looking at various types of writing such as a setting description of Hamelin, a character description for the Pied Piper and many more! We hope to share a few with you!!

<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will continue to tackle multiplication and division, before moving on to length, perimeter, and fractions next half term. Children in Year 3 have been


working hard to learn their 3, 4 and 8 times tables! Our favourite ways to learn have been through listening to songs and playing games with the counting stick.

Geography



In Geography this half term, we will be having a study of a London. We will be identifying how it has changed over the years, labelling key monuments, and weighing up the advantages and disadvantages of living there.

Furthermore, children will also be challenged to try and make a musical instrument that design where pitch and volume can be changed out of recycled materials.
